Doosan Forklift Parts - Doosan Infracore Company Ltd. is an international company consisting of Diesel Engines, Defense Industry goods, Industrial Vehicles, Construction Equipment and Machine Tools and Automation Systems.

Their United States affiliate, Doosan Infracore America Corporation, stationed in Suwanee, Georgia houses a 170,000 square foot production facility, home to a Compact Equipment and Construction division. Cleveland, Ohio houses the Lift Truck division, and West Caldwell, New Jersey has a Machine Tool department. The U.S. headquarters in Georgia facilitates a first rate parts operation capable of supplying an excess of 25,000 line items to support Lift Truck, Compact Equipment, Machine Tool and Construction customer needs.

With a network consisting of over 90 autonomous dealers, the forklift group supplies quality materials handling equipment to the comprehensive North American market. Doosan Infracore America Forklift dealers successfully operate in over 220 service and sales places throughout Canada and the U.S. The forklift product line impressively features 63 different machines consisting of 82 various battery and engine configurations of Electric-powered and Internal Combustion lift trucks. Capacities of these numerous vehicle models vary from 3,000 to 33,000 lbs. All vehicles are designed in an ISO 9001 qualified facility.

Doosan Infracore America is the fastest emerging forklift and lift truck corporation in the North American marketplace, thanks to its exceptional level of product performance and their persistently high level of consumer support and service given to all Doosan Infracore Forklift clients. The U.S. forklift division stationed in Cleveland has a expert team knowledgeable in Sales, Purchasing, Marketing, Logistical and Technical Support.

Korea's original home-based lift truck marketplace was an open-import enterprise. In the 1960's, Korea Machinery Co. Ltd. started to import assembled forklifts as part of a national machinery expansion project. Early sales of this industrial equipment focused on large business communities, the armed services and on state-run companies. This ultimately led to a unification with Daewoo Heavy Industries Ltd. In 1976, the Forklift Division commenced business operations throughout Korea to service and sell this heavy equipment. By 1978, a lift truck production plant was successfully completed. Continuous technical instruction grew to become the new focus for enhancing quality and product development.

Daewoo started the first domestic lift truck business in 1967, and quickly acquired a whopping 90% share in the Korean Materials Handling market. By the 1980's, Daewoo's advanced technological improvements combined with sales success placed them in a situation of significant expansion of their forklift business.

In 1981, Caterpillar Industrial Inc. of the United States, proposed a cooperative venture project to respond to competitive pressures in the US materials handling market. This venture drastically expanded Daewoo's forklift sales. Construction was completed in 1984 to facilitate a modern plant which helped set up the business for the fabrication of high added-value products suited for export. In 1993, the company had a international sales network and started exporting versions they had established through in-house expertise, as an sovereign brand. Certifications were then acquired from CE of Europe, UL of the United States and ISO 14001 and ISO 9001, securing expansion opportunities into overseas marketplaces.
